

***Australian Pharmacist* Guidelines for authors of research papers**

Australian Pharmacist is the official journal of the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia and the leading publication in Australia for education and best practice for practising pharmacists. Each month it publishes continuing professional development, clinical reviews and special interest columns; as well as news, commentary and debate on issues affecting the pharmacy profession across the nation. It also publishes original research.

Submission of manuscripts

Submission of manuscripts reporting original research, particularly relating to the practice of pharmacy in Australia, is encouraged. These articles must be offered exclusively, and conform to the Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals as set down by the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors.

Manuscripts should include an abstract, author details and contact details for correspondence. They should not be more than 3,500 words in length (not including references, tables and figures) and should follow a standard format of: introduction, method, results, and conclusion/discussion.

Authors should send their manuscripts via email, in Word format. At the head of the article, include the author's/authors' name/s, relevant qualifications and positions held.

Do not use headers or footers, automatic referencing or footnotes. Include a separate word count – as close as possible to the above mentioned word count – for the manuscript proper. Tables and figures should be submitted in electronic format as separate files, not embedded in the Word document containing the main manuscript.

Referencing

Referencing is in the Vancouver style, with journal names abbreviated. Personal communication, unpublished texts and web site addresses should be included in the list of references.

Manuscripts must be written in concise English with spelling following the Macquarie Dictionary (The Macquarie Library, Sydney). Generic names should be used for medications where possible, and all measurements given in SI units.

Conflict of interest

Any source of financial or other support, or professional positions and relationships, which may cause a conflict must be declared along with submission of the manuscript, and may be published at the discretion of the Editor.

Peer review

All research manuscripts are peer reviewed by appropriate pharmacy academics. All reviewing is blinded, both for the reviewer and the author. Publication is dependent on successful peer review, with the final decision resting with the

Editor. Any revisions required or suggested will be discussed with the author, with the author expected to make any required revisions.
