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COVID-19 Update No. 34

This alert updates the 14 April 2020 COVID-19 ALERT.

- The outbreak in the North-West related to the North-West Regional Hospital (NWRH) and the North-West Private Hospital (NWPH) is being investigated and managed. There are currently 81 cases associated with this outbreak.
- The North-West has been designated a geographical localised area with risk of community transmission.
- The North-West Regional Hospital (NWRH) and North-West Private Hospital (NWPH) are closed to protect the health of patients, staff and the north west community. Inpatients have been transferred to other health facilities, with appropriate infection control procedures. Patients requiring emergency care are being transported to other hospitals as appropriate.
- All staff (and students) who have worked in the NWRH or NWPH since 27 March, and their household members, must self-quarantine for 14 days from the day of the staff member's last shift. **Quarantined staff are being offered testing.**
- All patients discharged from the NWRH or NWPH since 27 March, and their household members, must self-quarantine for 14 days from the day of discharge.
- Anyone who has visited the NWRH or NWPH in the last 14 days should continue social distancing and monitor themselves
 for signs of fever and respiratory symptoms including cough, sore throat, shortness of breath. If they develop symptoms they
 should be tested.

Please help identify possible cases in and from the North-West. There is increased testing capacity (up to 500 per day).

- **GPs in the North-West:** Any patient presenting with fever or acute respiratory infection, including cough, sore throat or shortness of breath = **test or refer for testing at a THS Respiratory Clinic.** There is now a drive through testing facility in Burnie. Patients can be referred through the normal pathway.
- GPs in the North and South: Any patient with fever or acute respiratory infection, including cough, sore throat or shortness of breath, who has spent time in the North-West in the previous 14 days = test or refer for testing at a THS Respiratory Clinic.
- Continue to test or refer for testing at a THS Respiratory Clinic patients who meet criteria for testing, as per the Information for General Practice sheet (v12).
- For patients who recently had contact with a known case or spent time (as a patient, staff member or visitor) in the NWRH, NWPH or the Mersey Community Hospital, please refer for testing through the THS Respiratory Clinics (for timely results).
- For other patients, either collect swabs in your surgery (if there is access to appropriate PPE, swabs and transport media) and forward through your routine pathology provider or refer for testing at THS Respiratory Clinics.
- Please instruct all patients tested for COVID-19 to self-isolate at home until results are provided.
- As at 6:00 pm 14 April 2020, there have been 165 cases confirmed in Tasmania and six deaths. 73 infections were acquired locally and 18 are being investigated to determine the source of infection. 57 people have been cleared the virus and are no longer in isolation. 2540 contacts are self-isolating and being monitored. There have been 4,646 tests conducted.
- The focus of the public health response remains to delay widespread community transmission in Tasmania, through rapid response, investigation and increased testing in areas where community transmission may be suspected.
- The Department of Health is seeking expressions of interest from doctors, nurses, midwives and allied health professionals
 to register for a surge workforce for emerging staffing pressures. See

What to do:
