


Information for Prescribers



Image-Based Prescriptions

From 17 April 2020, medical practitioners and nurse practitioners in NSW can issue an image-based prescription for most medicines to a community pharmacy by email or fax for dispensing.

This temporary measure will facilitate telehealth consultations and access to medicines during the COVID-19 response. This measure is in place until 4 April 2021.



What you need to know

- Image-based prescriptions cannot be prescribed or dispensed for Schedule 4 Appendix D medicines (e.g. benzodiazepines) or Schedule 8 medicines (e.g. opioids).
- An image-based prescription is issued the same way as a regular prescription. You must sign it by hand. A digital signature is not permitted.
- You can fax the signed prescription to a community pharmacy, scan it and email it to a pharmacy, or photograph it and email it to a pharmacy. Do not email or text it to a patient.
- You can include instructions for a repeat supply. Repeats will be held in the same pharmacy as the original supply.
- ⊘ You must keep the signed physical prescription securely at your practice for two years.
- Find an email address for a community pharmacy using your search engine or tools such as www. findapharmacy.com.au. It is advisable to confirm details before sending an email or fax.
