# COVID-19 Update No. 47

This alert updates the 02 May 2020 COVID-19 ALERT.

- Statewide, please test or refer for testing ALL patients with ANY respiratory symptoms (even mild), including rhinorrheoa, fever, cough, sore throat or shortness of breath.
- Despite there being no new cases in several days, please stay vigilant and test/refer for testing anyone with any symptoms.
- Testing options now include:
  - THS Respiratory Clinics see attached for locations.
  - GP-led Respiratory Clinics (Devonport, Launceston, St Helens) see PHT pathways for information.
  - GP-collected swabs and referral through normal procedures if appropriate PPE and sampling equipment is available.
  - Refer to COVID-19 Update No. 46 (May 2) for residential aged care testing information.
- For high to very high-risk patients (see GP Info Sheet v15) please, for now and where feasible, continue to refer to THS Respiratory Clinics for testing, for timeliness of results.

- The North-West remains a designated localised area with risk of community transmission.
- Please continue to provide negative test results to patients you test or refer for testing.

#### What to do:

- Use the COVID-19 GP Info Sheet v15 when assessing and managing patients with symptoms of COVID-19.
- Provide patients being tested with the updated 'I'm being tested. What do I need to know?' fact sheet.

#### Table 1: Current high to very high-risk patients in Tasmania (for more details, see the GP Info Sheet v15)

Very	I. Any patient with any clinical symptoms who:
high risk	<ul> <li>has had close contact with a confirmed case in the 14 days before illness onset.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>travelled interstate in the 14 days before illness onset.</li> </ul>
High	Any patient with clinical symptoms who:
risk	<ol> <li>Lives in aged care/other residential care facilities or group residential facilities (e.g correctional facility, boarding schools) where there are two or more plausibly-linked people with clinical symptoms.</li> </ol>
	2. Living in or who has travelled through North West Tasmania in the 14 days before illness onset.
